Dear Parishioner,

In 2020 and 2022 we will have the great privilege of celebrating the bicentenary of our two special Churches. We thank God for the generous contribution of so many over those 200 years towards the strengthening of our Parish community which continues today.

A Bicentenary Committee is being put in place to organise the celebration of these very special anniversaries. It is hoped that a book covering the history of our two churches will be produced as part of our celebration.

Our churches have seen many significant happy and joyful personal family occasions over the years - Weddings, Baptisms, First Holy Communions and Confirmations. They have also been a source of great comfort, strength and support at times of sadness and grief. Through it all, we support one another in good times and bad.

Given the age of these buildings, there is much ongoing maintenance required. We have, in recent times, carried out extensive restoration works to Knockea Church. The stained glass windows, which had fallen into considerable disrepair, have been refurbished with new storm glazing installed, new doors have been fitted in keeping with the character of the building and the church has been painted externally. Donoughmore church windows require similar work as a matter of urgency.

Our main source of funding for these works is our weekly collection and the monthly Restoration Fund envelope which was introduced in January 2019. We hope to set up a Society of Friends of Donoughmore and Knockea Churches to help raising further funds to mitigate costs relating to works already completed and yet to be undertaken on both Churches. We will, in due course, circulate details in that regard.

We would very much welcome all donations to these projects particularly now as we prepare for our 200 year celebration. We would be most grateful if you could make some donation, however small. Any such donation will help to ensure that our future generations will enjoy our Parish, Faith and community support which we ourselves have been so blessed with.
